* The Department of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) has issued guidance (revised 3/28/20) to states and localities to assist in identifying essential/critical workforce as they consider COVID-related restrictions. In food and agriculture sectors, these workers include, among others: Workers supporting groceries, pharmacies, convenience stores, and other retailers selling human food and beverage products, including retail customer support service and information technology support staff necessary for online orders, pickup and delivery; restaurant carry-out and quick serve food operations, including dark kitchen and food prep centers, and carry-out and delivery food employees; employees of food manufacturers and their suppliers, including beverage production facilities (as well as production by human food facilities of by-products for animal food); and employees and firms supporting beverage distribution (including warehouse workers, vendor managed inventory controllers and block chain managers).
